In Afghanistan, more than 80% of women are unable to read or write. While young Afghan girls increasingly have access to primary school, their sisters, mothers and grandmothers continue to miss out on education.

The Afghan Australian Development Organisation (AADO) works with rural communities in Afghanistan to establish women's education groups and carry out six month literacy programs.

Participants learn literacy and numeracy, as well as basic health, hygiene, nutrition and life-skills, helping them to build confidence and enhance their ability to contribute to their community.
