In the district of Qarabagh, in northern Afghanistan, there is only one secondary school for 150,000 people. The Afghan Australian Development Organisation (AADO) supports senior students at the Abdul Wakim Shayed school in Qarabagh to improve their education and give them a better chance to go on to university. AADO provides after-school and remedial classes, gives dedicated local teachers the opportunity to participate in professional training and equips the school library and science lab with badly needed resources.
